No. 4445 Equity In the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity May Term 1879

The order of publication heretofore passed in this cause having been duly published and John A. Powell and John Roberts non-residents of the State of Maryland defendants in the above cause, having failed to appear and answer the Bill of Complaint: it is therefore this 15th day of July A. D. 1879 by the Circuit Court for Frederick County and by and with the authority of said Court as judge, ordered and decreed that the said Bill of Complaint be and the same is hereby taken pro confesso, against said non-resident defendants, and the defendants Rosanna Stout and Jacob R. Stout having been duly summoned to appear to the Bill of Complaint in above cause filed and having failed to appear thereto it is therefore this day of July A. D. 1879 further ordered and decreed by said Court that the Complainant is entitled to relief in the premises. But for that it doth not, certainly appear to what relief the Complainant is entitled it is still further ordered and decreed that a commission issue to the standing Commissioners of this Court to take testimony to support the allegations of the Bill.
