The Complainant filed with the Commissioner as evidence "Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5" and "A. B." which are herewith returned by the said Commissioner

Winfield S. Pattengall a witness of lawful age, produced in part of the Complainant, being duly sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant & herewith returned, deposes and says, To the 1st Int. - I have known all the parties for some time.

2d Int. - Was he dead He died in October 1879, in Frederick County Maryland.

3d Int. - He did. He left a widow named Sarah Jane Sharp and an infant daughter named Lilla A. Sharp, who now reside at Middleburg, Carroll County, Md.

4th Int. - I was acquainted with George Henry Sharp, during his lifetime I am well acquainted with his handwriting I have seen him sign his name frequently. I look at Exhibits No. 1, & "A. B." now here shown me. The signature "George Henry Sharp" attached to said Exhibits is in the proper handwriting of the said George Henry Sharp.

5th Int. - He left personal estate to the amount of about \$80, or 90\$, and, to my knowledge, he was indebted far beyond that amount.
