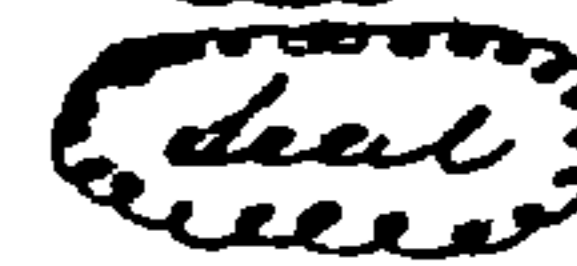

This Indenture made this 26 day of December 1849 between John M. Fetterling & Ruth A. Fetterling his wife of Frederick County & State of Maryland of the one part & Reuben Hurlbess of the same County & State of the other part, Witnesseth, that whereas the late John Fetterling died by his last Will & Testament bearing date the 25th day of August 1841 as by reference thereto will more fully appear, will & devise to his wife Elizabeth Fetterling the Home Farm on which he then resided for & during her widow-hood as well of her share of his personal & real estate which said provision was accepted by the said Elizabeth Fetterling & whereas said Will further provided that after the death or marriage of the said Elizabeth Fetterling he the said John Fetterling devised said Home Farm to his two youngest sons Geo M. Fetterling & George St. Fetterling in equal portions by paying out certain legacies therein mentioned to Sarah Fetterling & Susanna Fetterling as by reference to said Will, will appear on the payment of which legacies the title to said John M. Fetterling & George St. Fetterling should be, clear & undisputable to said Farm. - Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said parties of the first part for & in consideration of the sum of One thousand one hundred dollars the payment of a certain legacy to one of the youngest daughters of the aforesaid John Fetterling dec'd as expressed in his last Will & Testament as by reference thereto will more fully appear to be paid in current money of the United States by the said Reuben Hurlbess before the sealing
