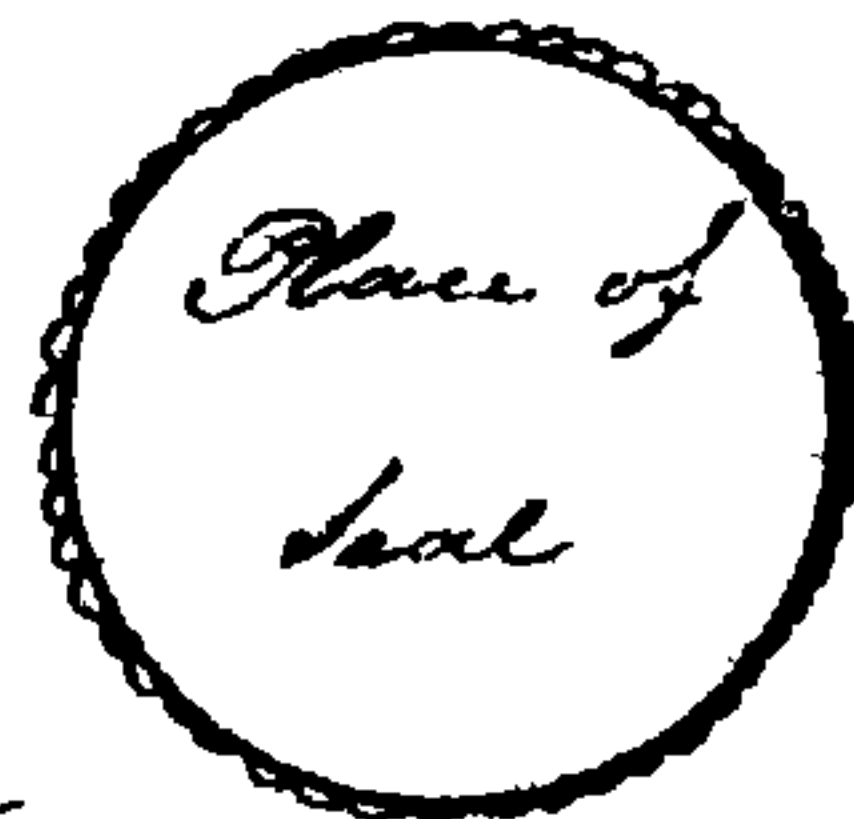

This Indenture made this 19th day of September in the year of  
Our Lord 1837 between Robert E. Halsey of Baltimore County in the State of  
Maryland of the one part, and Thomas J. Warlow of Frederick County in the  
State of Virginia of the other part. Whereas by a decree of the Frederick County  
Court sitting as a Court of Equity bearing date the 28th day of August 1835  
the above named Robert E. Halsey was appointed a commissioner to sell the  
Real Estate of Elizabeth W. Marshall (as specified in No 1421 Equity) late  
of Frederick County and State of Maryland deceased for the benefit of her  
heirs, the then guardian of said Halsey the said Trustee did on the 29th day of  
August 1835 sell and dispose of to the above named Thomas Warlow two parcels  
of Land consisting of part of a tract called The Return, part of a tract called  
The Lane Manor and part of a tract called The Return, and part of a tract called  
The Lane Manor at and for the sum of Five thousand Seven hundred and
