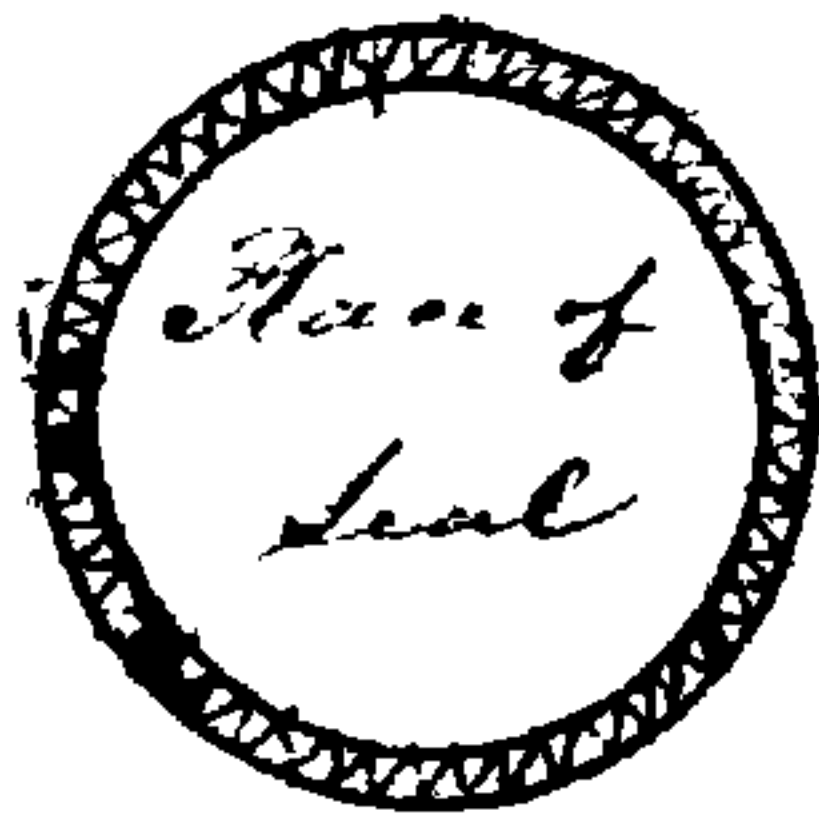

The Petitioner of Alpheus M. Cudde of the State of Missouri respectfully shew to your Honor, that on the 22nd day of September in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty nine, Your Petitioner obtained a Judgment in the Circuit Court for Frederick County against a certain Parmenio Marlow for the sum of seven hundred and ninety three dollars and ninety seven cents, with interest from date & costs of suit, as appears by a certified copy of such Judgment herewith exhibited and marked Exhibit A, which your Petitioner prays may be taken and considered as part of this his Petition.

Your Petitioner further states that a certain Mr. Thomas J. Marlow, by his last will and testament duly executed according to the Laws of the State of Maryland devised certain portions of his real estate, to his wife and to two of his sisters for and during their lives and after their death to his children which will appear by reference to a certified copy of said last will and testament filed as Exhibit No. 1 in 4506, Equity in the Equity docket of your Honorable Court.

Your Petitioner states that by virtue of this Judgment aforesaid, he had a lien on the share of the said Parmenio in common with other Judgments of the same date against said Parmenio in and to the portion which descended to him as brother and one of the heirs at law of William Corroll Marlow a deceased brother, whose interest in said lands devised by the will of said Thomas J. Marlow was one undivided Eleventh part.

Your Petitioner further states that on the 13th day of July 1879 Margaret E. Harbrow Cohees towards in common, filed their Bill of Complaint in your Honorable Court for a sale of part of the Real Estate devised by the last will and testament of said Mr. Thomas J. Marlow to his children, and the death of William J. Marlow one of the children is a big deal and his share descended to his brother and sister.
