Agreement of certain parties

It is hereby agreed by and between Parmour Marlow, Maria Marlow, Margaret Elizabeth Marlow, Sarah R Clapham and Samuel Clapham her husband, Mary Eliza Marlow, being parties to the above cause, and Mrs A. Broadwater, that whereas, Truise Marlow in his life time being indebted to his mother Mary Marlow by his two notes one dated Nov 15. 1866, for fourteen hundred and fifty two & 57/100 Dollars and one dated Oct 30<sup>th</sup> 1864 for one thousand dollars, did assign all his, the said Truise Marlow's interest in the Real Estate described in the proceedings in the above case and the proceeds of the sale thereof to said Mary Marlow by assignment in writing dated the day of A. D. 1875 and whereas the said Parmour Marlow, Maria Marlow and one William G. Marlow were partners under the name of William G Marlow & Sons, and as such were indebted to their father Thos J Marlow in his life time and for which they did on the 15 day of June A. D. 1866, give their note to Jas R Marlow Executor of said Thos J. Marlow for the sum of fifteen hundred and two dollars with interest from date, which note has never been paid except the sum of One hundred and seventy dollar paid on the 28 day of February A. D. 1857; and whereas the said Maria Marlow being indebted to his mother the said Mary Marlow in the sum of three hundred dollars did upon the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1864, execute and deliver to said Mary Marlow his note for said amount, with interest from date, and pledge his interest in his father's estate for the payment of the same.
