Bill of Complaint

of West Virginia, respectfully shew to your Honors that your Complainant and his brother George Washington Purdy are seized in fee of a tract or parcel of Land, situate in Frederick County State of Maryland being part of a Tract of Land called "Hobbs Purchase" containing about Ten acres of Land, more or less, and particularly described in a deed from Samuel Talbott and Catherine Talbott his wife doctrs to said Richard Purdy and George W.
