Ans. - In regard to filing exceptions to my application for a decree to sell the real estate.

42d Q. Sub. - When did she learn that you had filed an application for a decree?

43d Q. Sub. - Who told her?

46th Q. Sub. - At the time the Bill was filed in this case, did she authorize you to make her a party to it?

Ans. - I should know how to answer that question. I don't think I should say "Yes" or "No" to any such question.

47th Q. Sub. - Had she not said to you, that she was satisfied with the agreement she made with her father; and has she not said so, since his death?

Ans. - I don't know that she did.

48th Q. Sub. - What is the best of your recollection on that matter?

Ans. - About the substance of what she said to me, that before she would ratify, or make any trouble about father's estate, she would do with what she had.

49th Q. Sub. - When did she say that?

Ans. - I don't remember just when since the filing of the Bill - within the last four months.

50th Q. Sub. - Had you at that time told her there were objections filed to the sale?

Ans. - Probably I did.

51st Q. Sub. - Was she a widow at the time, and is she now?

Ans. - Not so, and she is a widow now.

52d Q. Sub. - Had you shown her the agreement then or at any time?

Ans. - I don't remember whether I did, or not. I don't think I did.

53d Q. Sub. - Had you talked to your other sisters and their husbands, after the death of your father, about "Exhibit B," and if yes, what was said?

Ans. - I don't recollect of having any conversation with any other sisters on the subject.

54th Q. Sub. - When did Robert McHenry die?

Ans. - In the fall of 1876.

55th Q. Sub. - Had you consulted counsel about "Exhibit B," after your father's death?

Ans. - I asked the opinion of Mr. Ross.

56th Q. Sub. - Was Mr. Ross the only one?

Ans. - I think I made mention to Mr. McHenry about it.

57th Q. Sub. - You said in answer to one of the Cross Interrogatories, that the signatures to "Exhibit B" were yours and your sisters. Please state, whether yourself, they and their husbands, are now willing to stand to the agreement, with reference to the five thousand dollars advanced to each of you, made with your father, while he was alive?
