Be it known, that you are appointed Commissioners to examine Evidences in a cause depending in the Circuit Court of Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, between Samuel Angel, Complainant, and Charles Valentine Doub, John W. Anderson, and Martha J. Anderson his wife, and others defendant. You are therefore required, having first taken the Oath hereunto annexed, and also administered the annexed oath to the person whom you shall appoint, as Clerk, to attend the execution of this commission, that, at such time and place as to you shall seem convenient, you cause to come before you all such Evidences as shall be named and produced to you by either the complainant, or defendant, and that you examine them on their corporal oaths, to be by you administered, upon the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, touching their knowledge, or remembrance of anything that may relate to the cause aforesaid; and that you cause notice to be given to the parties or their Attorneys, of the execution of this commission, before you execute the same.
