D. 1885, pursuant to previous notice thereof, did then, and there in the presence of Complainant's Solicitor, and Charles V. Kloub, one of the defendants, proceed to take the following testimony, to wit:

Testimony

Charles V. Kloub a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn, and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant, and herewith returned deposes and says,

To 1st Int. - My name is Charles V. Kloub. I am seventeen years of age, and reside in Frederick City Maryland

To 2d Int. - I know the parties, and have known them for years I am one of the defendants.

To 3d Int. - I did know Elizabeth Kloub she was my mother. She is dead. She died November 26th A. D. 1879. She left a will. She was a widow at the time of her death, and had been a widow since A. D. 1876.

To 4th Int. - I saw, and heard the will read after my mother's death. The paper here shown me marked Exhibit No. 2 is a certified copy of the will of my mother.

To 5th Int. - Samuel Angel has out letters testamentary on said will

To 6th Int. - She did, de seized, and possessed of real and personal estate situated in Frederick city Maryland. The paper here shown me marked Exhibit No. 1 describes the real estate of which said Elizabeth Kloub died seized, and possessed.

To 7th Int. - She left no children but witnesses.

To 8th Int. - Witness and John Davidson, and wife Martha J. Davidson reside in Frederick County. Mary A. Angel, and Theodore Hoffman and Louisa Hoffman his wife reside in Carroll County Maryland. William H. Jackson and Alice Jackson his wife reside in Huntington County Pennsylvania All of them are of age but witnesses

To 9th Int. - She left a very small personal estate, it is worth about One hundred dollars. I look at paper shown me marked Exhibit No. 4. It is about a fair valuation of said personal property.

To 10th Int. - I am acquainted with the handwriting of Elizabeth A. Kloub. I look at Exhibits 5 6 7 & 8 here shown me. They are signed by Elizabeth
