Testimony

Benjamin Poole, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn, and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and herewith returned, deposes, and says

To 1st Sub. - My name is Benjamin Poole I am 57 years old and reside in Carroll County.

To 2^d Sub. - I know all the parties, and have known them for several years

To 3^d Sub. - I knew Elizabeth Kloub, and have known her for twenty years she is dead, she died some time ago. She died testate. I wrote her will.

To 4th Sub. - I look at paper shown me, marked Exhibit No. 2. It is a copy of the will of Elizabeth Kloub. Samuel Angel is the Executor named in the Will.

To 5th Sub. - He has taken out letters testamentary

To 6th Sub. - She had a house, and lot in Frederick but can't describe it.

To 7th Sub. - Elizabeth Kloub left but one child Charles V. Kloub.

To 8th Sub. - Charles V. Kloub and Martha J. Kloub reside in Frederick City Mary A. Angel reside in Carroll County. Mrs. Louisa Hoffman reside in Frederick County, and Mrs. Alice Jackson reside in Pennsylvania.

To 9th Sub. - She left very little personal property I think.

To 10th Sub. - I have seen her write, and witnessed one of the notes, and her will And the signatures to Exhibits 5, 6, 7 and 8 here shown me are in handwriting of Elizabeth Kloub.

To 11th Sub. - She was indebted, at her death in amount of these notes to Samuel Angel and I think some small sums beside. She left no property to pay her debts house lot, and the small amount of personal property.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and neither party desiring further time for the production of their evidence the Commissioner, closed the said Commission, and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal this fourth day of March A. D. 1880.
