And may it further please your Honor to grant to your Complainants an order of publication, against said Sarah Matilda Roberts and Alfred Polata, her husband, Mary E. Baker and Saml. Jacob Baker, her husband, and Saml. Warfield, who are non-residents, giving them notice of the object and substance of this bill, and warning them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on or before some certain day, in person or by Solicitor, and show cause if any they have, why a decree should not pass as prayed.

And may it still further please your Honors to order and direct that a Commission be issued to two persons residing near said Saml. Warfield, who is a non-resident infant, empowering them to appoint a guardian for said infant, and take the course of said infant by such guardian to this Bill of Complaint.

At the request of Alexander Warfield the following deed was recorded March 29, 1858.

This Indenture, made this twenty-first day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty eight, between John Engel and Nancy Engel his wife of Frederick County, and State of Maryland, of the one part, and Alexander Warfield of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said John Engel and Nancy Engel aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and twenty seven dollars and seventy five cents current money to them in hand paid by the said Alexander Warfield the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; and the said Alexander Warfield therefore acquitted & discharged, hath given granted, bargained sold, aliened, enfeoffed, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, convey and confirm unto the said Alexander Warfield his heirs and assigns forever; the following described part of a tract or parcel of Land, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, being part of that part of a tract or parcel of land which belonged to Owen Purcell, decd. and by him bequeathed by will to Jemima Ann Burgess it being known and distinguished as parts of the tracts called "Warfield's Lot," and "The Reserve on Good Neighbourhood," beginning for the part hereby intended to be conveyed, at a stone said to be at the end of the twelfth line of part of the aforesaid tracts of Land as was by Commission laid off to Samuel Burgess the father of said Owen Burgess, and running thence, allowing and correcting so as to correspond with the boundaries thereof: first North seventy seven and a quarter degrees West forty four perches, North eighty one degrees West forty and eight tenths perches to a stone, North fifty degrees East fifty seven and a quarter perches; South forty three and three quarters degrees East fifty three perches to a stone; South thirteen and three quarters degrees
