The Petitioner filed with the Commissioner as evidence "Exhibits Nos 1 & 2 & 3," which are herewith returned by the said Commissioner

Edward L. Wingling, a witness of lawful age, produced upon the part of the Petitioner, being duly sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Petitioner and herewith returned, deposes & says, to the

1st Int. - I know all the parties and have known them for some years.

2d Int. - I saw. I look at "Exhibits Nos 1 & 2," now here shown me. The signatures "William G. Wingling" thereto attached are in the handwriting of the said William G. Wingling. I have often seen him write and I am acquainted with his handwriting.

3d Int. - I did he is dead. He died at his residence in Frederick County, Maryland, in May 1880.

4th Int. - Yes sir, he left children, as follows, namely, John W. Wingling, adult; Edward L. Wingling, adult; Fadore A. Wingling, adult; and William J. J. Wingling; all residing in Frederick County, Maryland; Sarah A., wife of Daniel J. Fout, adult; and Eliza J., wife of Reuben B. Picketts, adult, residing then in Frederick County, Maryland.

5th Int. - Eliza J., wife of Reuben B. Picketts, died about two weeks after her father William G. Wingling, leaving a husband Reuben B. Picketts, and the following children, namely; Franklin, Edward G., Eva and Lillie Jane Picketts, all infants under the age of twenty one years and all residing in Frederick County, Maryland, except Lillie Jane Picketts, who died in July 1880, since the decease of her mother, and also Sarah A. Fout, wife of Daniel J. Fout, who also died about the first of August 1880, intestate and without issue.

6th Int. - His personal estate is not sufficient for the payment of his debts. John W. Wingling is the administrator and I am his agent in settling the estate of the said William G. Wingling, deceased, and his personal estate is wholly insolvent and insufficient for the payment of his debts.

Joseph O. Moolley, a witness of lawful age, produced upon the part of the Petitioner, being duly sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Petitioner and herewith returned, deposes and says to the

1st Int. - I have known all the parties for some years.

2d Int. - I saw. I have often seen him write. I look at "Exhibits Nos 1 & 2" now here shown me. The signatures "William G. Wingling" attached thereto are in the proper handwriting of said William G. Wingling, and were signed thereto in my presence. There is still due and owing on "Exhibit No. 1," the sum of Two hundred and sixty dollars (260 \$), with interest from the 13th of April, 1879, and on "Exhibit No. 2," the sum of One hundred dollars (100 \$), with interest from the 28th of December 1879.
