5th Int.:- Eliza J. wife of Reuben P. Picketts, died about two weeks after her father William S. Appling, leaving a husband, the said Reuben P. Picketts, and the following children, to wit: Franklin, Edward G. Eva and Lillie Jane Picketts, all infants under the age of twenty years, and all now residing in Frederick County, Maryland, except Lillie Jane Picketts who died, since the decease of her mother, in July 1880, intestate and without issue.

6th Int. - I know that his personal property is not sufficient to pay his debts I don't think his personal estate is worth more than three hundred dollars (300\$).
