Interrogatories to be propounded to witnesses to be produced on the part of the Complainant.

1. Are you, or not, acquainted with the parties to this suit or any or either of them? If yes, state how long you have known them.
2. Were you or not acquainted with one Daniel Kline late of Frederick County? If yes, is he dead or alive; if dead when and where did he die?
3. Was or was not the said Daniel Kline seized, and possessed of any real estate situated in the State of Maryland at the time of his death? If yes look at papers now shown you, marked "Exhibits Nos 1, 2 and 3" and state whether said Exhibits, contain a correct description of said land?
4. Did or did not the said Daniel Kline leave any children surviving him? If yes, state their names, ages, condition in life and place of residence
5. Are you or not acquainted with the handwriting of the said Daniel Kline? If yes, look at the paper now here shown you, marked "Exhibit A," and state in whose handwriting the name "Daniel Kline" is?
6. Look at the paper now shown you, marked "Exhibit B," and state whether or not the articles charged therein were sold and delivered to the said decedent, and whether they have ever been settled for, either in whole or in part, except the credits therein given, and state your means of knowing.
7. Did or did not the said Daniel Kline leave any personal property, and is or is not said personal property sufficient to pay his debts?
8. State whether said real estate, after so much thereof is sold as is necessary to pay the debts of said decedent, can be advantageously divided among the parties interested without loss or injury, and state state the reasons for your opinion on this subject?
9. State whether or not it would be to the advantage of all parties interested, infant and adult, that said real estate should be sold, and the proceeds divided among the parties entitled in proportion to their respective claims and rights and your reasons for the opinion you entertain on this subject?
