- 4 To the heirs of Henry Kuhn, a dec^d brother of intestate and whose name, or names and residence of any, is unknown to your Complainant
- 5 To the heirs of Jeremiah Kuhn, a dec^d brother of intestate, and whose name or names, and residence, of any, is unknown to your Complainant.
- 6 Mary, a sister of the intestate, and now the wife of Ephraim Carnack Esq and who resides in Mechanicstown, Frederick County.
- 7 Eliza Mantz, a sister of intestate, who resides in Baltimore city.

And your Complainant charges that the unknown heirs of Joseph Kuhn, and of Henry Kuhn, and of Jeremiah Kuhn and of Margaret Staley, and their residences, are unknown to your Complainant, and that they together with Joseph Kuhn, Frank Kuhn, and Eliza Herring, children of Gebulon Kuhn, dec^d, are non-residents of the State of Maryland and do not reside therein.

To the end therefore that the Defendants hereafter named may answer the several matters and things, the same as if they were here, and as if they were thereunto specially interrogated, and that the mortgaged premises aforesaid, or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be sold for payment of your Complainant's claim, with interest as aforesaid, and that your Complainant may have such other, and further relief as the nature and equity of the case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant to grant unto your Complainant an order of Publication, giving notice to the unknown heirs of Joseph Kuhn, and of Henry Kuhn, and of Jeremiah Kuhn, dec^d, brothers of said Cassandra Pickney, and of Margaret Staley a dec^d sister, Joseph Kuhn, and Eliza Herring, children of Gebulon Kuhn, dec^d, who are non-residents, as before stated, of the substance and effect of this Bill, and warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before, a certain day to answer the premises and show cause if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed - And also a writ of Subpoena against the said Leonard Pickney - Mary Carnack, and Ephraim Carnack her husband of Frederick County, State of Maryland and Eliza Mantz, Frank Kuhn of Baltimore city, and against Louisa Herlbes, and Ellen Jane Kuhn, of Queenstown, Carroll County, Maryland, commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises, and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein And as in duty &c
