Petition of Matilda Shafer

The Petition of Matilda Shafer of Frederick County, State of Maryland, shows unto your Honorable Court that sometime in the year 1851 George S Brongle late of Frederick County, deceased, departed this life giving and bequeathing unto his sister Mrs. Matilda Shafer, your petitioner, during her life time, the interest on Five hundred dollars, the interest to be paid her annually during her life, that Lewis A.
