Hundred Dollars with interest from date, which said notes due owing and unpaid. That said Harriet Weaver was in her life time seized and possessed of certain real estate situated in the village of Myersville Frederick County, State of Maryland which she purchased of Jacob Harcup, a copy of which deed is exhibited with said Bill of Complaint. That said Harriet Weaver died intestate in the month of June 1880, and that Letters of Administration on her personal estate were granted to Alexis C. Smith, who has entered upon his trust and that the personal estate of said Harriet Weaver is wholly insufficient for the payment of her debts, and that it will be necessary to sell the Real Estate of which she died seized and possessed for the payment of the same.

That Harriet Weaver died intestate, unmarried, and without issue, leaving Christian Weaver, a brother, intermarried with Mary Mallard Mary Smith, a sister - and

William Thomas Emms only son & child of Melaney Emms and deceased sister her only heir, at Law to whom the Real estate in these proceedings mentioned descended.

That Christian Weaver and Mary Weaver his wife, are non-residents of the State of Maryland, and do not reside therein.

It is therefore this Good day of July 1880, adjudged, and ordered that the Complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the seventh day of August 1880, give notice to the said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the tenth day of November next to answer the premises and show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
