attack was a slight one, and only affected her nose for a few days; and the third attack on her side was completely paralyzed, so that she was entirely disabled and could not move herself at all, and she had to be lifted about as required. She first came to live with the Petitioner about the first day of October 1877, and continued there until the 27th of April 1881, when she died.

To the 3d Sub:— Taking into Consideration of the trouble, and disagreeableness of the services required of the Petitioner, I think that thirty-five dollars per month would be a very reasonable charge.

4th Sub:— No ser, she did not. The whole of the personal property, of which she was possessed, was worth about fifteen dollars, (\$15) I am the Agent of Mrs. Crum, the Petitioner, who is the executrix of Mrs. Ellen Wood, deceased, and was appointed such by the Orphans Court, of Frederick County, Maryland.

5th Sub:— She died, and at the request of Mrs. Ellen Wood

Testimony

James A. Hartsock, a witness of lawful age, produced upon the part of the Petitioner, being duly sworn, and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Petitioner, and herewith returned, deposes and says

To the 1st Sub:— Yes ser. I have known them all for a number of years. They and I reside in Johnsonville District, Frederick County, Maryland.

2d Sub:— She came there about four years ago, and remained there until the time of her death, which occurred during last spring.

3d Sub:— Yes ser, I did. The most of the four years she was sick all the time, the latter portion of it she was entirely helpless. I would suppose it was worth thirty-eight or forty dollars (\$38 or \$40) per month to board, clothe and attend to her.

Whereupon, there being no other witnesses present to be examined, and no further time being required for the production of Evidence, the Commissioner closed the said Commission, and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal, on this 29th day of September, A. D. 1881
