Order of Publication

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of a tract of Land lying and being in Frederick County Maryland which Martin S. Grove died seized and possessed of

- The Bill states that said Martin S. Grove died recently intestate, owning a tract of Land called "Catch as Catch can" he that gets the Land is the best man", "I have lost the most," and "Americus," and described in the proceedings fully and leaving a widow and the following children, and Grand-children him surviving as his next of kin, and here at law, viz:
1 Sara Grove widow of Martin S. Grove
2 Hiram J. Grove a son, married to Anna Mary Grove
3 Charlotte C. Whip a daughter, married to Samuel D. Whip.
4 Charles H. Lighter husband of Virginia C. Lighter, a deceased daughter
Edward M. S. Lighter a son of said Virginia C. Lighter deceased.
Alma D. S. Lighter, an infant, daughter of said Virginia C. Lighter deceased.
5 Samuel R. Grove a son, married to Julia Grove
6 Martin M. Grove a son, married but whose wife's name is unknown to your Orator and Oratrix
7 Louisa E. Hemas, a daughter, married to Zachariah B. Hemas

That the said Alma D. Lighter is an infant under twenty-one years of age; and that said Martin M. Grove and his wife whose name is unknown as aforesaid are non-residents of the State of Maryland and do not reside therein; that said land is not susceptible of partition or division, and that it will be to the interest and advantage of all parties concerned, both infants and adults, that said land be sold and the proceeds divided among those entitled;

The Bill prays for a decree for the sale of the land, for process against the resident and for an Order of Publication against the non-resident defendants.

It is therefore this Fifteenth day of January A. D. 1881 adjudged & ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, that the Complainants by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County Maryland, once a week in each of four successive weeks before the first day of March next give notice to the said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, and warn them to be and appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the fourth day of June next to answer the premises and show cause if any they have why the relief prayed for should not be granted.
