The Report of sales of an made by Mary M. Zimmerman and Fleet Staley

 Examiner, a newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland for more than
 three successive weeks prior to the day of sale, and by handbills extensively circu-
 lated, they did pursuant to said notice attend on the premises on the 27th day of May
 A. D. 1882, at 1 O'clock P. M. as advertised and then and there offered to sell
 said Real estate to the highest bidder - they first offered that tract of land men-
 tioned in said advertisement as John A. J. Zimmermans "Home Farm", containing
 fifty-two acres of Land more or less, which tract of land is situated in the 32
 Election District in Frederick County, Maryland, about five miles North West of
