- 5th Int. Look at "Exhibit No. 1," and state whose signatures and seals are attached thereto as having executed it and said persons so executed it?
- 5th Ans. I look at "Exhibit No. 1." Besides myself there are the signatures and seals of Emilie A. Bowser and William M. Bowser. The said Agreement was signed and executed by the persons whose signatures and seals are thereunto attached.
- 10th Int. State whether or not you delivered possession of the premises mentioned in "Exhibit No. 2" to the said Emilie A. Bowser - If yes, when?
- 10th Ans. I did so deliver possession of the premises on the 22d day of March 1873.
- 7th Int. How much has been paid on account of said purchase, money in cash?
- 7th Ans. Seventy five (\$75⁰⁰) in cash.
- 8th Int. State whether or not any part of said purchase money has been paid in any other manner, by whom and with what understanding and agreement?
- 8th Ans. It has; the sum of \$129⁰⁰ was paid by Shovemaker's Bill, in a settlement with Adam Bowser. It was agreed to be appropriated, and accredited on the payment of the purchase money for said land.
- 9th Int. Are you now able, and willing to give the said Emilie A. Bowser and William M. Bowser, a proper conveyance of a good and unencumbered estate in fee?
- 9th Ans. I am.
- 11th Int. How much of said purchase money still remains due and unpaid?
- 11th Ans. The sum of \$276⁰⁰ in, with interest from November 2^d 1881.
- 11th Int. Are any of the parties defendant married? If yes, state husband's and wife's names.
- 11th Ans. They are. Adam Bowser and Emilie A. Bowser are husband and wife and William M. Bowser and Margaret Bowser are husband and wife.
- 12th Int. Are you married? If yes, state your wife's name, and is she willing that said real estate should be sold free of her dower?
- 12th Ans. I am married. My wife's name is Margaret S. Eyer. She is willing for the said real estate to be sold free of her claim to dower therein.

Whereupon there being no other witnesses to be examined and no further time being required for the production of evidence, the Commissioner closed the said Commission and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal this 17th day of May A. D. 1882.
