This Mortgage, made this fifteenth day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty eight by Samuel Getzendanner of Frederick County in the State of Maryland; Witnesseth, Whereas the said Samuel Getzendanner by his note bearing even date herewith, and payable twelve months after date, with interest from date, stands indebted unto George Smith of the County and State aforesaid, in the sum of seventy five Dollars; And Whereas also the said Samuel Getzendanner, together with George Smith aforesaid, as his surety stands indebted unto the following named persons in the several sums of money hereinafter specified, to wit: Unto Samuel Dixon, in the sum of two hundred Dollars, upon a note dated the 18th day of October in the year 1857, payable six months after date with interest from date; and unto Andrew Heim, in the sum of seventy three Dollars and forty six cents, upon a note bearing even date herewith payable twelve months after date with interest from date; And unto Harriet Pattenhall in the sum of fifty dollars upon a note dated the 22 day of April in the year 1858, payable twelve months after date with interest from date; And unto Clifford And Torrey, in the sum of eighty Dollars upon a note bearing even date with these presents, payable six months after date, with interest from date; And unto Jacob M. Rushey in the sum of seventy Dollars and eighty two cents debt and One dollar and eighteen cents, costs upon a Judgment dated 1st November 1858, in which the said George Smith is superseder; and unto William Johnson in the sum of Eighty three dollars and fifty two cents debt, and One Dollar and eighteen cents costs, upon a Judgment dated the 16th day of October, 1858, in which the said George Smith is superseder; And unto William H. Johnson, in the sum of twenty Dollars, and fifteen cents debt, and One dollar and thirty cents costs upon a Judgment dated the 16th day of October, 1858, in which the said George Smith is also superseder; All of which Judgments were rendered by, and superseded before James M.
