The Defendant admits, that on the 19th day of November, in the year 1855, he came into possession in his own right and title of a certain lot of land situate and lying in Frederick County, and State of Maryland, and which is now particularly described in a deed from James W. Castle and his wife to said Samuel Getzendanner, dated on the 19th day of November A. D. 1855.

And recorded in Liber G. S. No. 8, folios 185 & 186 &c, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which, deed is filed as Exhibit No. 1, to said Bill of Complaint.

The Defendant further answering, admits, that on the fifteenth day of November in the year 1858, he made and executed to a certain George Smith, now deceased, of the said County and State, a certain deed of Mortgage for the purpose of securing and indemnifying to him the payments of the sum of money therein mentioned: That on the 10th day of April A. D. 1876, a certain George William Smith, Executor of George Smith aforesaid, now deceased, assigned, transferred, and set over unto Sarah Getzendanner the said Mortgage above referred to, for value received, and that a certified copy of said Mortgage and assignment is filed as Exhibit 2, to said Bill of Complaint.
