At the execution of the annexed Commission, issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and to me directed, and empowering me to examine Evidences in the Cause therein depending, between Martha A. Mull and George A. Mull her husband, and others, as Complainants and Samuel Getzendanner & as Defendants, I, William P. Ans. - I am acquainted with all of the parties, and have known them all for a number of years.

2nd Int. - Did you, as Executor of George Smith, deceased, sell and assign the Mortgage from Samuel Getzendanner to George Smith, a copy of which is now shown you, marked "Exhibit No. 2", to Sarah Getzendanner, and if you, what amount of money did she pay you for the same?

Ans. - I did. On the Eighth day of January 1876, she paid me Four hundred and thirty one dollars and fifty cents (\$431.50). She paid the 1st balance on the tenth day of April 1876, of Two hundred and forty five dollars and seventy cents (\$245.70). I here file receipt, marked "Exhibit G. W.
