To the Honorable, the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity.

In this Cause I have charged the Trustee with the amount of Trust funds reported; I have then allowed him the usual Chancery Commission, the costs of the foreclosure and the taxes remaining on the real estate sold due and unpaid. I have then allowed to the Trustee the amount of his Mortgage debt due and unpaid, and have further allowed him the sum of Eighteen dollars and fifty-two cents (\$18.⁶²) to pay off the unpaid balance of the Judgment of Reisneider vs. Devillies. I have then left the remainder of the funds, to wit, the sum of Eleven hundred and nine dollars and sixty-two cents (\$1109.⁶²) in the hands of the Trustee subject to the further orders of Your Honorable Court
