May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainant the writ of subpoena directed to the said Mary C. Eckenrode, Emily J. Eckenrode, John J. Eckenrode and Catharine Eckenrode his wife, Margaret A. Hahn and Ferdinand Hahn her husband, and John J. Eckenrode as Administrator of Samuel W. Eckenrode deceased, and Mary C. Patterson commanding them to appear in this Court on some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises, and abide by, and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

And may it please your Honors to grant to your Complainant an order of Publication giving notice to the non-resident defendants Jerome W. Eckenrode and Jane L. Eckenrode his wife, and Jerome W. Eckenrode as Administrator of Samuel W. Eckenrode deceased of the substance and object of this Bill, and warning them to appear in person or by Solicitor in this Court on some certain day to be named therein to show cause if any they have why a decree should not pass as prayed.
