2d Ans. Samuel Clifffendall was indebted to me by Mortgage. The Mortgage debt originally was for \$978.⁰⁰, the whole of which has been paid except One hundred and ninety (190.⁰⁰) dollars with interest thereon from January 16th, 1880.

To the 3rd Sub.

3rd Ans. - I am acquainted with the handwriting of Samuel Clifffendall. I look at "Exhibit No 3" now shown me. The signature "Samuel Clifffendall" thereon is in the hand-writing of Samuel Clifffendall, one of the Defendants in this Cause.

To the 4th Sub.

4th Ans. - After the execution of said "Exhibit No. 3," Henry J. Reever took possession of the land described in "Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2" filed with the Bill of Complaint in this Cause.

To the 5th Sub.

5th Ans. - Henry J. Reever paid on the purchase money of said land, Two hundred in Cash when he took possession of said premises. He afterwards paid the first note of Three hundred and thirty three $\frac{33\frac{1}{2}}{100}$ dollars (\$333 $\frac{33\frac{1}{2}}{100}$). That is all he paid.
