Whereas, John A. C. Lippe & Eleonora Lippe his wife
Cornelius J. Main & Sophia B. Main his wife et al, have lately exhibited
their Bill of Complaint before us in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sit-
ting as a Court of Equity, against Catharine Lippe, Widow of John George Lippe
decd. and Catharine E. Lippe. And Whereas, We have by our writ, lately com-
manded the said Defendants to appear before us in said Court as a Court of
Equity, at a certain day now past, to answer the said Bill of Complaint, but for
as much as the said Catharine E. Lippe is a non Compro Defendant, and cannot an-
swer the said Bill of Complaint nor defend this suit, without having a guardian as-
signed in that behalf. Now we, therefore, that we have given unto you full power &
authority, in pursuance of the special order in said Court, to assign and appoint a
guardian ad litem for the aforesaid non Compro defendant, and to take the answer of said
non compro defendant by such guardian, to the said Bill of Complaint, or such guar-
dian's corporal oath upon the Holy Evangelys, to be by you administered; the said an-
swer being distinctly and plainly written; and when you shall have taken the said
answer, you are to send the same closed up under your seal, together with your cer-
tificate of your having assigned and appointed such guardian as aforesaid, and
this writ unto us in said Court.
