Look at "Exhibit No. 4", now shown you and state whether or not the Real Estate therein described is that of which the said Andrew Coffman died seized and possessed?

5th Ans. - He died seized and possessed of Real Estate situated in Frederick County, Maryland, consisting of a farm of about 114 acres and worth \$2000<sup>00</sup> or \$3000.<sup>00</sup>. I look at "Exhibit No. 4". It does describe the Real Estate of which the said Andrew Coffman died seized and possessed.

6th Sub. - Did said Andrew Coffman die leaving a widow surviving him, and did he leave any children or other heirs at Law, and if yea give their names, ages and places of residence and if any are married, give the names of their husbands or wives?

6th Ans. - He left no widow surviving him. He left the following children as his only heirs at Law, viz: -

(1) James C. Coffman, married to Susan his wife, both of whom are adults, over 21 years of age.

(2) Elizabeth M. Coffman, an unmarried adult over 21 years of age.

(3) William C. Coffman, an unmarried adult over 21 years of age.

(4) Charles Edward Coffman, an infant under 21 years of age.

(5) Andrew David Coffman, an infant under 21 years of age.

(6) Cornelius S. Coffman, an infant under 21 years of age.

(7) Martha A. Coffman an infant under 21 years of age.

(8) Ephraim Franklin Coffman an infant under 21 years of age. All of these parties reside in Frederick County, Maryland.

7th Sub. - Was the said Andrew Coffman or not indebted to the Complainant James C. Coffman at the time of his death, and if yea, for what and to what amount, and has such indebtedness ever been paid? Look at the paper now shown you marked "Exhibit No. 1", and state whether or not the same contains a true statement of such indebtedness. State fully all your knowledge herein?

7th Ans. - The said Andrew Coffman was indebted to the Complainant for money loaned in the sum of \$52.<sup>00</sup>. I look at "Exhibit No. 1", It is a true statement of such indebtedness, and the same has never been paid.
