Bill of Complaint

The Bill of Complaint of Samuel J. Haffner and Susan R. Haffner his wife, Mary E. Batey, Lewis Martz and Margaret Martz his wife, of Frederick County, who sue as well for themselves as all other creditors of Randolph M. Whitmore late of said County deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, respectfully states that a certain Randolph M. Whitmore late of Frederick County, deceased was in his life time indebted unto your complainant Susan R. Haffner who was then Susan R. Whitmore but has lately intermarried with Samuel J. Haffner, in the sum of One thousand Dollars, with interest from the seventeenth day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, on a certain promissory note payable twelve months after date to William M. Teaga or order, and by him assigned, the said William M. Teaga having been the guardian of her the said Susan R. Whitmore, now Susan R. Haffner, and unto your Complainant Mary E. Batey, in the sum of Seven hundred dollars, with interest from the first day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy-four, upon a single Bill for seven hundred Dollars, with interest from date, dated on the first day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy-one payable twelve months after date, on which interest was paid by said Randolph M. Whitmore in his lifetime for three years; and to your Complainant Margaret Martz in the sum of Thirty-five dollars, with interest from the day of September in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-seven upon a promissory note which has been lost or mislaid, and your Complainants file herewith as part hereof copies of said promissory note held by said Susan R. Haffner and single Bill marked respectively Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2.

And your Complainants further state that the said Randolph M. Whitmore in his lifetime being seized and possessed of the Real estate in Frederick County described in a deed from John M. Whitmore and Joseph G. Miller Executors to said Randolph M. Whitmore, a duly certified copy whereof is herewith filed as part hereof, marked Exhibit No. 3, and possibly other real estate on or about the fifteenth day of May in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy-eight duly made and executed his last Will and testament in writing and thereby amongst other things devised all his real estate to his then wife Ann B. Whitmore so long as she shall remain unmarried and his widow, directing the same to be sold at her death or marriage whichever may first occur, at public sale, the proceeds after payment of expenses and costs to be disposed of as follows - Two thousand dollars to be paid to his widow the said Ann B. Whitmore if she die in the event of her marriage, Two thousand Dollars to his niece the said Susan R. J.
