No. 4819 Equity In the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity.

May Term, 1882,

Ann O. Whitmore Executrix of Randolph M. Whitmore dec'd and others

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for a sale of so much of the real estate of which Randolph M. Whitmore late of Frederick County died seized and possessed, as may be necessary for the payment of so much of the debts due the Complainants and all others who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, as remain unsatisfied after the application of the personal estate thereto. The Bill states that Randolph M. Whitmore was at the time of his death indebted unto the Complainant Susan R. Haffner in the sum of One thousand Dollars with interest from the 17th day of July A. D. 1877, on a promissory note assigned her by William M. Seager, and was indebted at the time of his death to the Complainant Mary E. Baley in the sum of seven hundred Dollars with interest from the first day of June A. D. 1874 upon a single Bill, and was indebted at the time of his death to the Complainant Margaret Martz in the sum of thirty-five dollars with interest from the — day of September A. D. 1877, on a promissory note. That the said Randolph M. Whitmore died seized and possessed of certain real estate situated in Frederick County therein described leaving a last Will and Testament which has been duly probated wherein he devised all his real estate to his widow Ann O. Whitmore so long as she shall remain unmarried directing the same to be sold at her death or marriage and the proceeds disposed of as follows, Two thousand Dollars to be paid to be paid to his widow if she is in the event of her marriage, Two thousand Dollars to be paid to the Complainant Susan R. Haffner, fifteen Dollars to his brother John M. Whitmore the remainder to be divided into five equal shares, one of which is devised and bequeathed to the children of his brother William Whitmore, one to the children of his brother Nicholas Whitmore, one to the children of his sister Mary Ann Hedges, one to the children of his sister Ann Rebecca Schaeffer, and one to the children of his sister Phoebe Ann Martz, and said testator appointed his said widow Executrix of said Will to whom letters testamentary were granted and who possessed herself of the personal estate, some of which has been applied to the payment of debts of the Testator and the rest of which as Complainants are informed will be so applied: That the personal estate is not sufficient to discharge all the debts of said Testator, that said Ann O. Whitmore is an adult residing in Frederick County, that said John M. Whitmore is an adult, has no children and resides in Frederick County, that the children of William Whitmore, are William Whitmore Jr. Charles Whitmore, Thomas Whitmore who are adults residing in Frederick County, Clinton Whitmore, Jennie Whitmore, Frank Whitmore, Esther Whitmore, Mattie Whitmore, Mary Whitmore, Blanche Whitmore and Harry Whitmore who are infants under the age of twenty-one years residing in Frederick County, that the children of Nicholas Whitmore are Marietta J. Whitmore
