that at such time and place, as to you shall seem convenient, you cause to come before you all such Evidences, as shall be named and produced to you by either the complainant or defendant, and that you examine them on their corporal oaths, to be by you administered upon the Holy Evangelij of Almighty God, touching their knowledge or remembrance of anything that may relate to the cause, aforesaid; and that you cause notice to be given to the parties or their attorneys, of the execution of the commission, before you execute the same; and having reduced the depositions of the witness, so taken by you, into writing, you send the same, with this commission, closed under your hand and seal, into this Court as a Court of Equity, with all convenient speed.

### Commissioner's Oath.

So help you God.

At the execution of the Annexed Commission, issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and to me directed, and empowering me to examine evidences in the case therein depending, between Eliza Crouse, James M.
