19th Int. What did you agree to pay for the same?

Ans. Two thousand dollars (2,000\$).

20th Int. To whom was the same to be paid?

Ans. To John Wynn.

21st Int. When and to whom was the same paid?

Ans. It was paid to John Wynn at different times.

22d Int. In what sums, and when were they paid respectively?

Ans. The first sum, five hundred dollars (500\$) was paid in April 1860, when I got possession; the balance was in two notes, of four hundred dollars (400\$) each, payable in one and two years, and a mortgage of seven hundred (700\$) on the property, which I assumed, and took with the property; he gave one note to James Elder, and the other I paid to Wynn himself; I paid the mortgage with my wife's money; I don't know the time, but the records will show them.

Testimony of
Jas. A. Crudorff

23d Int. Did, or did not, any person pay any of said sums for you, at your request, or advance you any money to pay the same; if yes, state fully the particulars thereof?

Ans. My wife paid the mortgage of seven hundred dollars (700\$) with the money she got from her father's estate, at my request; I handled the money for her.

24th Int. (Waived as to this deponent.)

25th Int. When did you purchase the property, described in the deed, from Wynn and wife?

Ans. That's already been answered.

26th Int. How much did you pay in said property, before your marriage?

Ans. Nine hundred dollars (900\$) before I was married.

Whereupon, the said commission was, by consent, adjourned to the 26th day of July, A. D. 1881, at 11 O'Clock, A. M.; at which time, and at the place aforesaid, I then and there, in the presence of the Solicitors for the Complainants and defendants, proceed to take the following testimony, to wit:

Examination of James A. Crudorff, continued:

27th Int. From whom did you get the money to pay for said property, and when did you get it?

Ans. I paid five hundred dollars (500\$) in cash, which was my own money; the first note for four hundred dollars (400\$) was paid with my own money, to Wynn, and the second note for four hundred dollars (400\$) was payable to Wynn, and assigned to James Elder, by Wynn, which note was paid to Elder in full, but I can't say when, the day, nor year,
