it's been so long ago; but it was after the deed was given to me; I think it was paid in two different sums; (at the time of my marriage, it was agreed between my wife and me, and her father, John Cendorff, that he would pay for the same property, and that it was to belong to my wife; I had part of the purchase money shortly after my marriage; John Cendorff gave me One thousand dollars, (1000<sup>rs</sup>.) and shortly after that, three hundred dollars (300<sup>rs</sup>.) out of that money I paid myself what I had paid on the property, and the balance of the purchase money; then he agreed to pay the mortgage of seven hundred dollars, (700<sup>rs</sup>.) on the property, when it would be wanted or needed, but he died in the mean time; my wife paid the mortgage out of what she received from her father's estate after his death; it was agreed and understood that the property was to belong to her.

28th Int. Was any security given for said money; if yes, what?

Ans. There was no security given for it.

29th Int. Were any notes given for said money; if yes to whom, by whom and for what amounts?

Ans. No, sir, not for that money.

30th Int. When did you purchase the property described in the deed from John Walter, and Mary E. Walter his wife, and Joshua Miller?

Ans. Well, a few days before the deed was given.

31st Int. (Waived as to this deponent.)

32d Int. When did you first contract for said property?

Ans. (Waived as to this deponent.)

33d Int. Have you paid for said property?

Ans. Yes, it is paid for.

34th Int. How much did you pay on said property before your marriage?

Ans. Nothing.

35th Int. From whom did you get the money to pay on said property, and where did you get it?

Ans. John Cendorff, my wife's father, gave to her, and sent to her by me to pay for the property, One thousand dollars, (1,000<sup>rs</sup>.) and that the property was to belong to her - (Excepted to by the Complainant as not responsive to the interrogatory) - a few days before it was paid.

36th Int. When did you purchase the property described in the deed from John A. Paddy and Samuel Seabold, as Attorneys in fact for Jacob Plife and wife?

Ans. I think, to the best of my knowledge, in 1863, or 1864; the records will show.

37th Int. When did you first contract for it?

Ans. A few days before the date of the deed.
