Ans. I got the hardware from Hechring, of Littlestown, Pa. and the paints, glass, putty, and so-etc, from James A. Elder.

72d Sub. Have you paid Elder for his bill; if not, does he hold your obligation for the same; if yes, is your wife upon said obligation?

Ans. He holds my obligation for the same; my wife is not on the obligation.

73d Sub. Have you paid Hays, and what is the consideration of the Hays note and judgment mentioned in the bill?

Ans. I have not paid Hays, and the Hays note and judgment are for the tax work and putting the holes up.

74th Sub. Was your wife on the Hays note?

Ans. No, sir.

75 Sub. You say you contracted with Hiram Taylor to do the Carpenter's work of the new house; did, or did you not, say to him at that time, or when you were selecting the site for said house, that you were not such a fool as to put the house on land bought with your wife's money, but would put it on your own land, bought with your own money, or made to that effect?

Ans. No, sir; I do not recollect saying any thing of the kind; no, sir, I never said anything of the kind?

76th Sub. Look at paper marked "Exhibit C," and state whether you signed and made affidavit to the same?

Ans. I look at "Exhibit C," now here shown me; I signed said paper and made the affidavit thereon.

77th Sub. Prior to the deed from you to your wife, did you, or not, exercise control over all of said property, and speak of it as your own, and deal with it as your own?

Ans. I spoke of it as my own, because I had my home there, and the home of my wife and children; I exercised control over it, as husbands do over their wives' property; I did not deal with it, as my own.

78th Sub. Did you, or not, farm it yourself; if yes, did you keep, or render to her an account of the produce, and on what term did you farm it?

Ans. I farmed it myself, up to the 8th of August, 1878, the day I made the deed to my wife; I sold the produce raised on the farm, and the family was supported on that, as far as it went; I never rendered any account in particular to her; I had no terms with her at all, as to farming it.

79th Sub. Did you or not, authorize your brother, A. J. Crundorff, or any one else, to borrow several thousand dollars on said real estate for you, from "Frederick Town Savings Institution," representing the property to be your own, to be secured by a judgment to be confessed by you, as a lien on the same?

Ans. I did not authorize anybody to do any thing of the kind.
