Cross Examination

Ans. I know it was not understood that my father either gave or loaned either of these sums of money to James A. Orendoff, and it was understood that James A. Orendoff was not indebted to my father on account of the same; I know these sums were advanced to my sister, and the notes taken to show said advancements.

8th Q. Int. Have you any personal knowledge of notes of Josephus Orendoff, given to James A. Orendoff, and for what given; if yes, state the history thereof?

I have; some time after my father's death, my brother Josephus, agreed to give for my father's home place, twenty-five thousand dollars (25,000\$) my sister's share was eight thousand three hundred and thirty-three dollars thirty-three and one third cents (\$8,333.33 1/3) of the purchase money; my brother Josephus gave his note to James A.
