12th Q. Int. To whom, or in whose name was that deed taken and why? The deed was taken in my name, the same way all others were, as I have explained.

13th Q. Int. What piece of property was next acquired, and how was it acquired?

Ans. The next property was from Roddy and Lebold, as Attorneys for Rife and wife; my wife wanted to add the one hundred and seven (107) acres to her farm; she told her father, and he agreed to give her three thousand dollars, (\$3,000) to pay for it; he gave her the money and she paid it.

14th Q. Int. In whose name was said deed taken, and why; and by whom was it executed?

Ans. It was taken in my name, as all other deeds were taken, as I have explained.

15th Q. Int. What piece of property was next acquired, and how was it acquired?

Ans. The next property was the M. Kessick wood lot of ten acres and a half (10 1/2) acres, which she wanted for the use of her farm; her father told her to buy it, and he would pay for it; he gave her a part of the purchase money, which she gave to me to pay on account of the property; I bought the property for her, and paid what she gave me, and gave my note for the balance, which she paid out of her share of her father's estate, after his death.

16th Q. Int. In whose name was the deed for this property taken, and why?

Ans. It was taken in my name, as all other deeds were, as I have explained.

17th Q. Int. Who acted in contracting for, and negotiating the purchase of each piece of property, mentioned in the preceding cross-examination; state all the particulars exactly as near as you can?

Ans. I acted for her, in the negotiation for the purchase of each piece of property mentioned, I acted for her, and by her directions.

18th Q. Int. Was one dollar of the purchase money of either or any of the pieces of property mentioned in the deed, of the eighth of August, 1878, from you to your wife, paid by you out of your own monies?

Ans. There was not a dollar paid out of my own monies, except the nine hundred dollars, (\$900) paid for the Wynm property, which was repaid to me, as I have already explained.
