6th Ans. Two (2) brothers have died since the death of Daniel P. Duvall;—John H. Duvall and Benjamin F. Duvall and both died intestate.

(3) Charles E. Duvall an adult who lives in Baltimore City Maryland.

(4) Daniel P. Duvall an infant about 13 years of age who lives in Baltimore City Maryland.

(5) Bettie C. Duvall, an infant about 20 years of age who lives in Frederick County Maryland.

(6) Benjamin F. Duvall an infant about 18 years of age who lives in Frederick County Maryland.

(7) Thomas B. Duvall an infant about 16 years of age who resides in Frederick County Maryland.

(8) Scott N. Duvall an infant about 13 years of age who resides in Frederick County Maryland.

(9) Ruth A. Duvall an infant about 8 years of age who lives in Frederick County Maryland.
