5. Did said Thomas Pusey leave a widow now living, if you, give her name, age and place of residence?

6. Did said Thomas Pusey die seized and possessed of any real estate? If you, describe the same, state its quantity, value and where situated? Look at the papers now shown you marked Exhibits Nos 1. and 2. and state whether the real estate therein described is that of which said Thomas Pusey died seized and possessed?

7. Is said real estate susceptible of actual partition among all of said heirs at law and parties in interest without injury and loss, and would it or not be to the interest and advantage of all of said parties in interest, infant as well as adult for said real estate to be sold and the proceeds divided among them? State all you know with reference thereto and your reasons for your opinion?

8. Do you know anything of an agreement to sell said real estate to one Frederick H. Haubey? If you state all you know with reference to the same, whether it was in writing, by whom it was made and by whose authority and whether any money has been paid on the same and to whom?

9. State whether or not the said sum of Twenty one hundred dollars is a fair reasonable price for said real estate and as much as can reasonably be obtained for the same and whether or not in your opinion it would be to the interest and advantage of all said parties in interest, infants as well as adults for said sale for said amount to be ratified and confirmed and finally consummated, state fully your reasons for your opinion?

10. Do you know or can you state any other matter or thing that may be of benefit or advantage to the parties to this cause or either of them, or that may be material to the subject of this your examination or the matters in question between the parties? If you, state the same fully and at large in your answer.
