I will order & direct that when my youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years, that my Executor sell the said Real property and the residue of the personal property and the proceeds to distribute as follows, to my wife Joanna One third, and the residue to be equally divided between my son Henry Winfield Scott & my daughter Juliet Ellen Elizabeth in equal portions share and share alike.

And lastly: I do hereby constitute and appoint Peter Legenbeel to be my sole Executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and some other to be my last will and testament.

The answers of Scott Maynard and Juliet E. E. Maynard to the Petition of Dennis H. Maynard filed in the above case on the 18th day of January A. D. 1884. These respondents say for answer

1st They admit that Basil Maynard died on or about the 18th day of October A. D. 1883, and that he was at the time of his death indebted to said Dennis H. Maynard, as in said petition is alleged

2nd They admit that the personal estate of said Basil Maynard dec'd. is not sufficient to pay his debts

3 That these respondents are the only children and heirs at law of said Basil Maynard and they are willing that the surplus proceeds of sale in the above case after payment of liens and expenses of sale shall be applied to the payment of the just debts of said Basil Maynard dec'd
