The object of this suit is procure a decree for the sale of certain real estate of which William Hill late of Frederick County died seized and possessed.

The bill states that said William Hill died sometime in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty two being at the time of his death indebted to the complainant by his single bill dated the 25 day of February A.D. 1882 payable on day after date for the sum of twenty one & 99/100 dollars and which in indebtedness have never been paid; that he died leaving a last will and testament whereby he devised and bequeathed all his personal property to his widow May J. Hill and his real estate to her for life or widowhood with direction that after her death the same should be sold and the proceeds equally divided among his children and appointing W. H. Long as executor to whom letters Testamentary have been issued. That the personal estate of said William Hill is largely insufficient to pay the debts and it will be necessary to sell his real estate for that purpose; that said William Hill died seized and possessed of a tract of land containing about twelve acres situated in Frederick County and described in the deeds filed with the bill; that said William Hill died leaving said May J. Hill as his widow and Nancy Griffin and Geo Hill as his only children and that he had one other child named Rebecca Pully who died before her father leaving one child named Henry Pully who is an infant and a non resident and whose whereabouts is unknown to the Complainant, although he has made diligent enquiry to ascertain the same. The bill asks for a decree for the sale of said real estate to pay debts and for subpoenas against the resident defendants and an order of publication against said Henry Pully a non resident. It is thereupon adjudged and ordered that the complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for four successive weeks before the 27 day of January A.D. 1883 give notice to the said Henry Pully of the object and substance of this bill and warn him to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 28 day of April A.D. 1883 and show Cause, if any he has why a decree should not pass as prayed.
