Did said William Hill leave any Personal Property or estate and was the same sufficient to pay his debts? State fully all you know herein

11th Ans. He left some Personal property, which I believe was his - but his Property was not sufficient to pay his debts

12th Int.

Do you know anything further that would be of advantage to the Complainant? if so, state the same fully.

12th Ans. I know nothing further.

1st Int.

What is your name, age and place of residence?

1st Ans. My name is William M. Chipley - I am sixteen years of age and reside in Carroll County, Maryland at David E. Stem's Store.

2nd Int.

Do you know the parties to this Cause and how long have you known them?

2nd Ans. I know David E. Stem the complainant - but do not know the Defendants other than William H. Long and Mary Jane Hill

3rd Int.

Did you know William Hill late of Frederick County? is she living or dead?

3rd Ans. I knew William Hill in his life time, he is now dead, died about one year ago at his residence

4th Int.

Was William Hill indebted to the Complainant at the time of his death and if you, for what amount and has said indebtedness been paid?

4th Ans. Yes, Sir, he was indebted to David E. Stem the Complainant at the time of his death to the amount of Twenty one dollars and ninety two cents (\$21.92) with interest from February 25th 1892. This indebtedness has not been paid
