It is therefore, this 19th day of June in the year eighteen hundred and eighty three by the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold subject to the right of dower of Mary J.
