29th Int.

Did more than one Mr Still put any bid on the property?

29th Ans. That I don't remember.

30th Cross Int.

Do you know as a matter of fact whether your watch was correct on that day?

30th Ans. I do not know Sir.

William P. Miller, a Witness a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Respondent being duly sworn and Examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Respondent's Counsel and herewith returned deposes and says to the

1st Int.

Were you present at the sale, if yea about what time did it commence?

1st Ans. I was present; I had no time piece

2nd Int.

How long was the auctioneer engaged in selling the property? State your recollection

2nd Ans. I would suppose it was an hour

3rd Int.

Do you recollect the occasion and bidding just previous to the property being knocked down by the auctioneer? If yea, please detail the circumstances and state what time elapsed between the last bid and the time the property was knocked down?

3rd Ans. I recollect the bids and bidders to some extent. Dr Miller was one and he was a ready bidder; Messrs Maulsby & Co was another who seemed to be pondering whether they should bid or not; and just before the property was knocked down Mr Ramsburg put on one bid. I don't know whether it was, 2, 3 or 4 bids before the property was knocked off and Dr Miller put on the last bid which according to my recollection was \$59.⁷⁵ as for the length of time, I could not speak definite but there was ample time for any one to bid, equally as much as between the other bids.

4th Int.

Was warning given by the auctioneer, at that time, that unless there was an advance in the property he would knock it down? What was said?

4th Ans. Yea Sir.

5th Int.

Was Ramsburg present and within hearing distance of the auctioneer?

5th Ans. Yea Sir; to my recollection he was within from 8 to 12 feet from him
