To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County Sitting as a Court of Equity:

The Report of Sales of Samuel Putman of said County mortgagee of Sarah A V Putman and Bezekiah Putman her husband of said County & State respectfully shows unto your Honors that the said Sarah being indebted unto your Petitioner in the sum of \$ 650⁰⁰ and intending to secure the same, on the 4th day of April 1874 with her said husband executed to your Petitioner a mortgage of a certain farm of about 29 acres of land Situate in Johns Villes District in said County near Good Intent School House a little South of the road leading from Johns Villes to Ladiesburg and fully described in said mortgage which is herewith filed as Exhibit No 1. That to said mortgage deed there was a condition annexed that if the said Sarah should pay on or before the fourth day of April in the year 1875 to the said Samuel Putman the said sum with interest from said date according to the tenor of her promissory note of said date the mortgage to be void. That it was further provided by said mortgage that in case of default in the payment of said debt, then it shall be lawful for the said Samuel to sell the said mortgaged premises by public auction for Cash and the balance in twelve months from the day of Sale. after giving at least three weeks notice of the time, place and terms of sale in some newspaper published in Frederick County prior to the day of Sale and to apply the proceeds of such sale to the payment in the first place of the expenses attending such sale, then to the payment of the said debt, the surplus if any to pay to the said Sarah A V Putman
