At the Request of Lydia A. Fogle the following Deed is recorded May 15 1877  
This Deed, made this second day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and seventy seven by Lydia Ann Blessing of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Witnesseth that in Consideration of Six hundred and fifty Dollars (\$650) the said Lydia Ann Blessing does grant unto Lydia A. Fogle all that lot or parcel of land lying and being in Johns Hills District in the County and State aforesaid and is described as follows. Beginning at a Stone at the East Side of the public road running into Johns ville and being at the South West corner of Woodland formerly owned by Wesley Pepp and running thence allowing for variations to correspond with former location North 16 degrees East 8 1/2 perches to a Stone then leaving said line and running South 88 1/2 degrees East 37 1/2 perches to a Stone on a line of Edward Shinn's lot thence with a line of said Shinn's lot runned South 20 degrees West 8 1/3 perches to the end thereof to a Stone North 88 1/2 degrees West 39 perches to the place of beginning. Containing two acres of land more or less with all the appurtenances thereto belonging in fee simple. It being part of a tract of land called "The Reservoir on King fields Delight" or "The Reservoir on Long Tail" and being the tract of land conveyed by John Engler and Sarah E. Engler to Lydia Ann Blessing by and bearing date April 2 1875 and recorded in Gales T. G. No 3 folio 264 1/2 one of the Land Records of Frederick County
