In the name of God Amen, I James Huddle of L of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, being in perfect health of body and of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly business and affairs and thereby to be better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to Call me hence do therefore make this and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following that is to say: First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executrix hereinafter named and after my debts are paid and my funeral charges are defrayed, I devise and bequeath as follows:

I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Susan all my estate Real, personal and mixed provided she will never marry again but will stay a widow during her life, But in case she should marry again, I give her only one thousand dollars and in case she should marry again, I direct and order that all my property both personal and real be sold at public sale to the highest bidder and upon such terms and conditions as the Orphans Court may direct or order And after all my estate is reduced into money it shall form one fund and after the one thousand dollars which I allow my wife in case she should marry again is deducted from said aggregate amount I give and bequeath the balance to my children to each one an equal portion share and share alike. I wish my children to receive equal parts or portions in the distribution of my estate And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Susan Huddle to be my sole executrix of this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament.
