In pursuance of the annexed Order of Court and notice given me by the Solicitor for the Plaintiff in the above entitled Cause I William Wilcoxon one of the regular Examiners of said Court having fixed Thursday the 17th day of July A.D. 1884 at my office in Frederick City Maryland as the time and place for taking the testimony in this cause and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned, did then and there proceed to take the following testimony to wit:

The Plaintiff filed with the Examiner as Evidence Exhibits marked No 1. Nos. Exhibits A. C. J. O. H. and J. W. which are herewith returned by said Examiner

(Extract from a deed executed by Samuel Wolf and Mary Wolf his wife Henry Burn and Magdalena Burn his wife to Jacob Williams dated the 8th day of August eighteen hundred and forty and recorded on the 15th day of August 1840 in Liber A.D. No 11 folio 353 one of the Land Records of Frederick County. Also another part of the same tract of land called Pine Meadow and part of a tract of land called Good Hope. Beginning at the end of thirteen perches on the first line of George Moonland and running thence East fifty two perches South fifty six degrees East thirty four perches, South twenty one degrees West four and a half perches, South thirty nine degrees West Sixty one perches, North Eighty four degrees West thirty five and a half perches thence by a straight line to the beginning containing twenty five acres of land more or less.

To 1st Interrogatory

1st Ans. I know all the parties to this Suit and have known them for some years

To 2nd Interrogatory

2nd Ans. I was acquainted with Jacob Kline late of Frederick County, he is dead he died at his home near Wolfesville Frederick County Maryland for or six years ago.

To the 3rd Int

3rd Ans. He left no will

To 4th Int

4th Ans. He left some personal estate, it was not sufficient to pay his debts, John O'Hays was the Administrator of his Estate

To 5th Int

5th Ans. He was seized and possessed of Real Estate at the time of his death, he owned two separate parcels of land, both situated in Catoctin District Frederick County Maryland, the one known as the Home Place containing 19 acres of land
