Jacob Williams a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Examiner and herewith returned deposes and says:

To 1st Interrogatory

1st Ans. I know all the parties to this suit and have known them for some years.

To 2nd Int

2nd Ans. I was acquainted with Jacob Klein late of Frederick County, he is dead, he died at his house near Wolfville Frederick County Maryland five or six years ago about.

To 3rd Int.

3rd Ans. He left no will.

To 4th Int

4th Ans. He left some personal estate, it was not sufficient to pay his debts, John O. Mayo was the administrator of his estate

To 5th Int

5th Ans. He was seized and possessed of Real Estate at the time of his death. He owned two separate parcels of land both situated in Catoctin District Frederick County Maryland the one known as the Home Place containing 19 acres of land. The witness here looks at paper writing marked Exhibit Nos 1 and 2 here shown him and says they describe the Home Place. The other tract of land is partly timber and partly cleared land and contains about 25 acres of land, which he bought of one, the witness, Jesse and delivered a deed to him for it, about 40 years ago but what has become of the deed I don't know. The witness here looks at paper writing marked Exhibit A. W. and says it describes the said 25 acres of land.

To 6th Int

6th Ans. I would think both pieces ought to be worth \$1000.⁰⁰

To 7th Int.

7th Ans. He left a widow surviving him, her name is Mary Klein her age is about 70 years. At the time of the filing of this Bill she lived in Frederick County Maryland but since removed to Washington County Maryland.

To 8th Int

8th Ans. He left children and grand children. The children are a son, George H. Klein an adult and a resident of Frederick County, a son, Andrew J. Klein, a daughter, Mary C. Klein, a daughter, Susan A. who is married to Alexander Ridenour all of whom are adults and reside in Washington County, a daughter, Amy C. Klein an adult who died unmarried in Frederick County, she died in August 1883. A son, Jacob H. Klein who is married but whose wife's name is unknown to the witness, and a daughter, Hannah, married to Samuel Stoyor all of whom are adults and residents of the State of Illinois and the following Grand Children who are the daughters of Sarah Ridenour who was the daughter of Jacob Klein and who died before her father, namely: Clara Ridenour, Mary Ridenour and Josephine Ridenour all of whom are adults and residents of the State of Illinois

To 9th Int

9th Ans. She died at the Home Place in August 1883. She left no will, she left a very small amount of Personal Estate not sufficient to justify an administration

To 10th Int

10th Ans. Jacob Klein was indebted to the Plaintiff at the time of his death for medicines and medical attention. The witness here looks at Exhibit "A" here shown him and says he believes it to be a true and just statement of the indebtedness, and that it has
